### Rashtriya e-Pustakalaya

Rashtriya e-Pustakalaya, also known as the National e-Library, is a digital initiative launched by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, through the Department of School Education and Literacy in collaboration with the National Book Trust (NBT). It aims to promote reading habits among children and young adults by providing free access to a wide range of non-academic books in multiple Indian languages.

The platform offers fiction, biographies, poetry, self-help, adventure, comics, and classic literature suitable for readers aged 3 to 18 years. It supports multilingual learning, aligning with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 to foster creativity and cultural awareness through reading.

Currently, Rashtriya e-Pustakalaya hosts over **2,000 curated titles** across **23 Indian languages**, contributed by more than **40 publishers**. The collection continues to expand toward a target of **10,000+ books**. Users can access the library through a **web portal or mobile app** (available on Android and iOS) featuring offline reading, bookmarking, and text-to-speech tools.

By making diverse literature accessible anytime and anywhere, Rashtriya e-Pustakalaya bridges the digital divide, nurtures lifelong readers, and strengthens India's reading culture in the digital era.



**Dr. Mital Nirajbhai Manvar** Associate Professor, School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Atmiya University

Dr. Mital N. Manvar holds B.Pharm, M.Pharm, and Ph.D. degrees in Pharmaceutical Sciences, bringing over 17 years of academic and 3 years of industrial experience to her profession. Her core areas of expertise include Pharmacognosy, Phytochemistry, Pharmacology, and Herbal Drug Development. She has made notable research contributions with 15 publications in reputed national and international journals, authored the book "Interactions and Side Effects of Herbal Plants: Revealing Ayurveda," and contributed five book chapters to scholarly volumes. Dr. Manvar has presented 13 research papers at various national and international conferences and successfully completed nine funded projects focusing on herbal product development. Her research primarily explores the therapeutic potential of medicinal plants, including their anti-inflammatory, antioxidant, antimicrobial, anti-diabetic, and anti-coagulant properties.

She has received several accolades, including First Rank in Oral Presentation at the GUJCOST & DST-sponsored International e-Conference (2021). Dr. Manvar also serves as an editorial board member, reviewer, and evaluator for various academic and government initiatives under the Ministry of Education An active member of IQAC, Board of Studies, and MoU Committees at Atmiya University, she also participates in professional organizations such as the Association of Pharmaceutical Teachers of India (APTI), contributing significantly to education and research advancement.

### Library Team wants you to know...

Library Team wants you to know that when you are trying to read an article and hit the paywall, you are not alone. Everyday people around the world such as doctors, scientists, students and patients are denied access to the research they need. Interestingly, it is this obstacle that led David Carroll and Joseph McArthur, fondly called "The Button Boys", to create the Open Access Button. Launched on 18 November 2013, the Open Access Button is a plugin and a bookmarklet that requires no sign-in, and that suggests an open access version of an academic article behind paywall. As a source, all of the aggregated repositories in the world, hybrid articles, open access journals, and those on authors personal pages are used to locate the article. A few examples of such sources are CORE, BASE, Europe PMC etc. One unique feature of Open Access Button is also that when the open access version of any article is not available, the plugin allows directly the user to get in touch with the author and request for a copy of the article.
