

Dr. Mahesh M. Savant is an Associate Professor in the Department of Industrial Chemistry, Faculty of Sciences, Atmiya University. He holds an M.Sc. and Ph.D., with postdoctoral experience, and brings approximately 17 years of academic expertise.

Areas of Expertise: Synthetic Organic Chemistry, catalyst

development for organic synthesis, and heterocyclic chemistry. **Research Contributions**: Author of **38 publications** with around **463 citations** and hundreds of reads on ResearchGate. His notable recent work includes green synthetic approaches for heterocycles, microwave-assisted graphene oxide synthesis, and anticancer compound development.

Additional Contributions: Co-author of the books Ionic Liquids: Fundamentals & Applications* and Chemistry of Some Quinolone and Quinoline Derivatives.



Author of the Month

Dr. Shiyali Ramamrita Ranganathan

Dr. S.R. Ranganathan, born on 9 August 1892 in Shiyali (now Sirkazhi), Tamil Nadu, is celebrated as the Father of Library Science in India. Originally a mathematician, he became the first librarian of the University of Madras in 1924 and later transformed librarianship into a recognized profession.

His landmark contributions include the Five Laws of Library Science (1931) and the Colon Classification system (1933). He worked tirelessly for library education, public library legislation, and professional development in India.

He wrote more than **60 books** and numerous articles, leaving a global legacy in library science. Dr. Ranganathan passed away on **27 September 1972**.

Library orientation for newly students

E Library orientation session covers these key topics:

- Library layout and orientation: Understanding the physical spaces, sections, and facilities of the library to navigate it effectively.
- **Library resources**: Familiarization with print and electronic resources including books, journals, databases, multimedia, and digital collections.
- Using the library catalog and online databases: How to search and locate materials relevant to research or study.
- Library services: Information about reference assistance, interlibrary loans, document delivery, technology and computer support, and instruction services.
- Borrowing policies and procedures: Details on borrowing, returning, loan periods, fines, and rules for resource use.
- **Information literacy skills**: Instruction on evaluating sources for credibility, conducting effective research, and proper citation to avoid plagiarism.
- Accessibility and inclusivity: Awareness of accommodations, assistive technologies, and available support for diverse user needs.
- Introduction to library staff and experts: Opportunity to meet librarians and staff who can assist with research and resource usage.
- Encouragement of lifelong learning: Motivating users to engage continuously with library resources beyond the orientation.
