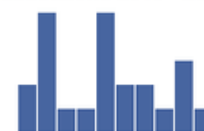

Dr. Bhargav N. Waghela is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Life Sciences. He holds M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees and has over 11 years of teaching and research experience in microbiology, molecular biology, and biotechnology. His academic work focuses on strengthening interdisciplinary research in life sciences and mentoring students in advanced biological techniques.

Dr. Waghela's research interests include **Molecular Biology, Genetics, Cellular Signaling, Cancer Biology, and Host-Pathogen Interactions**. His research work emphasizes **hereditary cancer variants, molecular signaling pathways in health and disease, mechanisms of drug resistance, and identification of bioactive compounds from natural sources**. He has contributed to studies involving **NADPH oxidases, endocytosis signaling, hereditary breast and ovarian cancer variants, and therapeutic potential of phytoconstituents**, supporting biomedical and translational research.

He has authored several research publications in reputed journals and actively participates in academic collaborations, student mentoring, and research activities. **His research impact includes approximately 473 citations with an h-index of around 10**, highlighting his contributions to molecular biology and biomedical sciences. 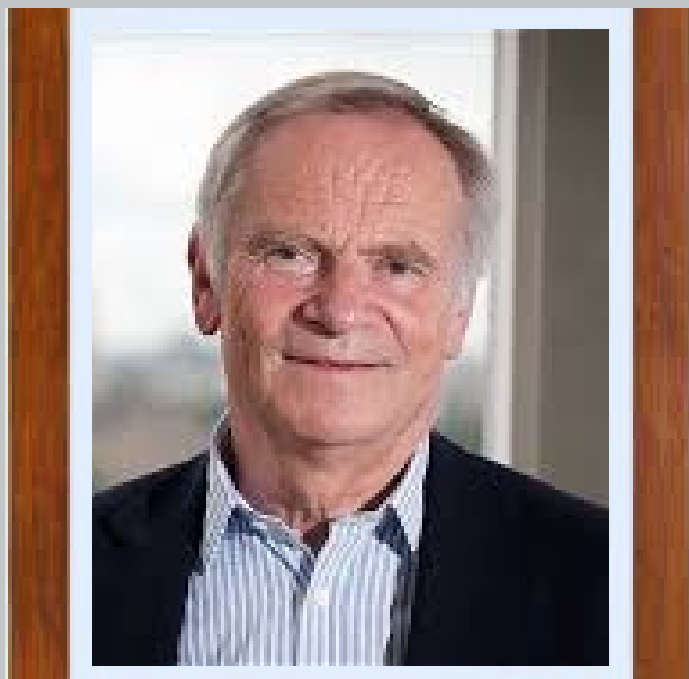

Author of the Month

Jeffrey Archer

Jeffrey Archer (born 15 April 1940, London) is a British author, storyteller, and former politician known for fast-paced novels and twist-ending short stories. He studied at Oxford and later became a Member of Parliament for the Conservative Party (1969–1974). After facing financial difficulties, he turned to writing and published his first novel, *Not a Penny More, Not a Penny Less*. His breakthrough came with *Kane and Abel*, which became an international bestseller.

Archer has written numerous popular books including *First Among Equals*, *The Clifton Chronicles*, and the *William Warwick* series. His works often focus on ambition, politics, business, and human relationships. Over his career, he has sold more than 300 million copies worldwide. Despite political controversies and a prison sentence in 2001, Archer continued writing successfully and remains one of the most widely read contemporary British authors.

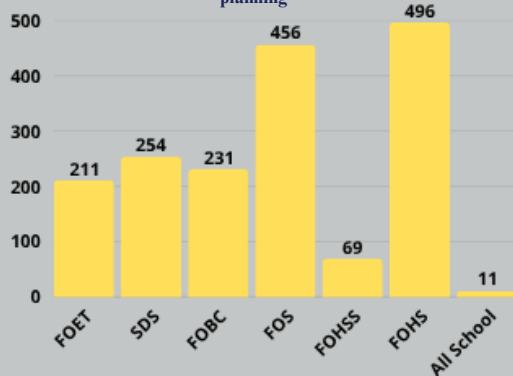

Library Usage Statistics for March 2026

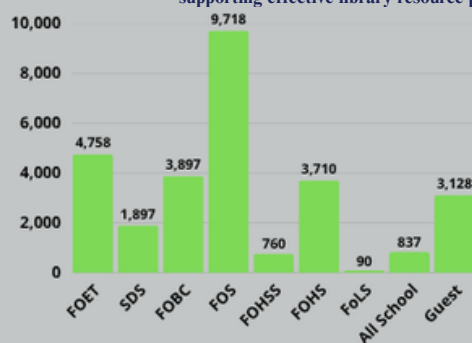
Book Transaction Statistics

"This chart illustrates book transaction statistics - monthly, department-wise, and categorized by circulation and reference helping identify user trends and support effective library resource planning"



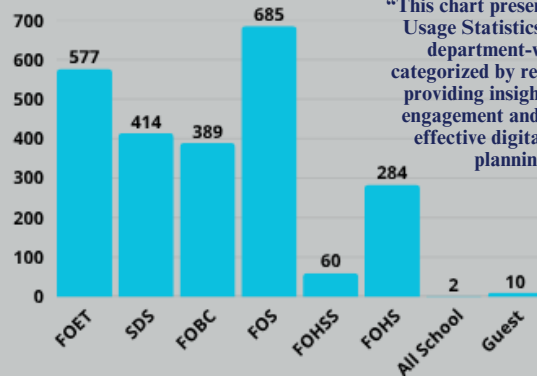
Reading Usage Statistics
